HOW IT WORKS

- You identify an organization(s) that you wish to benefit. If you need assistance in identifying an organization(s), our expert staff can recommend organizations in your interest area.
- You make a gift to the Foundation during your lifetime or through a bequest in your will. You can give cash, appreciated stocks, real estate, or other assets.
- We set up a special fund in your name or in the name of your choosing. Or, if you prefer, you may remain anonymous.
- You receive tax benefits in the year your gift is made.
- We handle all the administrative details, including managing specific qualifications that you may establish for grant disbursements and issuing grant awards in the name of the fund you establish.
- Your gift—and all future earnings from your gift—will be a permanent source of community capital, helping to do good work forever.

DONOR STORY: MAKING A DIFFERENCE*

Three times a week, Wendell Pittman delivers meals to homebound senior citizens as a volunteer for Meals for Seniors. Despite benefitting from volunteerism and a positive community reputation for more than a decade, the organization depended largely on small donations and lacked a predictable funding source. "Our organization needed more reliable funding, but we had trouble accepting large or complex gifts," says Mary Lynch, Meals for Seniors' executive director. After talking with Mary and with his financial adviser, Wendell decided to begin a designated fund with the Greater Milwaukee Foundation. He donated a piece of rental property that was becoming a bother in his retirement. The Foundation immediately sold the property and established the Wendell Pittman Fund. "We're thrilled to be working with the Foundation," says Mary. "Meals for Seniors would not have been able to do this on its own."
