A CRITICAL MOMENT IN MILWAUKEE

We are at a critical moment in our city as violence continues to have an increasing and enduring impact on individuals, families and neighborhoods. This crisis comes on the heels of a deadly pandemic, in the midst of a challenging economic climate and as we strive for racial justice.

In 2019, Milwaukee saw a steady decrease in homicides and non-fatal shootings. Since the onset of the pandemic, we have experienced a significant rise in homicides, non-fatal shootings, reckless driving, suicides and overdoses.

These incidents have escalated in 2022, exacerbated by the presence of COVID-19. The 10 neighborhoods with the highest number of victims include Franklin Heights, Juneau Town, Park West, Old North Milwaukee, Historic Mitchell Street, Harambee, Dineen Park, Hampton Heights, Rufus King and Wahl Park. Historically, summer has been more violent than other seasons and Milwaukee is on a path to a recordbreaking summer of violence.

A COMMUNITY-CENTERED RESPONSE

Greater Milwaukee Foundation President and CEO Ellen Gilligan acknowledged, "Violence affects the entire community, but its disproportionate toll on communities of color is tied directly to unjust systems forged by systemic racism. True to our North Star of racial equity and inclusion, the Foundation's focus will be to support people and places that build relationships, increase belonging, prevent harm and restore hope for a Milwaukee for all."

While Milwaukee is fortunate to have a cross-sector Violence Response Public Health and Safety Team as well as organizations – large and small – using proven models, they have been significantly under-resourced.

During this time of crisis, the Foundation is compelled to act with intention, coordinating with experts including the Medical College of Wisconsin's Critical Injury Center and the city of Milwaukee's Office of Violence Prevention to invest and mobilize resources in systems and services that support prevention, healing and community building this summer and beyond.



MKE RESPONDS to prevent violence and promote healing



\$1 MILLION INVESTMENT THROUGH THE POWER OF FLEXIBLE FUNDS

In direct response to recent, escalating violence in Milwaukee, the Foundation is dedicating an initial investment of \$1 million to support urgent healing, community building and violence prevention efforts as the first step in a multi-phase effort to deepen partnerships and support long-term systems change.

Plans for the funding include:

- \$465,000 to support grassroots organizations engaged in violence prevention, healing and community building through youth programming, violence interruption and other activities that strengthen relationships and address trauma
- **300,000 for the Violence Prevention Fund, administered by the Foundation with funding advised by the director of Milwaukee's Office of Violence Prevention. This will support OVP's intensive summer outreach strategy to employ violence suppression tactics by saturating nine target neighborhoods with resources and other pro-social activities.
- \$100,000 for Milwaukee Succeeds' Youth Forward MKE Coalition to invest in youthidentified violence prevention programming that increases access to mental health supports and creates more equitable and inclusive school environments
- \$100,000 to help families with funeral expenses for victims of violence
- \$35,000 to support mental health and wellness among the Foundation's own staff as they engage in their community-facing work

The Foundation can act quickly thanks to the foresight of donors whose philanthropy included the gift of flexible funds for a future they could not predict. Such funds empower the Foundation to respond to emerging and immediate needs and invest in deeper systemic change.
